










Setting Browser Cache to Remove Automatically Clear upon Exit

When you use the Internet to access web pages, files, images and other downloaded content, your web browser caches, or stores, information on your computer. Sometimes this creates access issues and this information must be cleared to resolve the issue. You may clear your cache on an ad-hoc basis or you may adjust browser settings to clear the cache upon exiting the browser. Doing this will clear all of your MFA settings for U Banking and will require a OTP each and every time you log in. In order to remove this setting please follow these procedures.

Browser	Action
Mozilla Firefox	<p>Go to the Options Menu by either going to the Hamburger Icon  at the top right-hand corner of the screen. Or by visiting the lower tool bar  at the bottom of the screen.</p> <p>Once you have the Options displayed, click on the Privacy tab, set the <i>History</i> dropdown to: Firefox will: Remember history.</p>  <p>Click the OK button. Exit all browsers and relaunch.</p>

<p>Internet Explorer</p>	<p>Go to the Internet Options Menu by selecting the gear icon  at the top right hand of the screen.</p> <p>On the <i>General</i> tab, in the Browsing history section, uncheck the <i>Delete browsing history on exit</i> box.</p> <p>Click the Apply button.</p> <p>Click the OK button.
